3. **Rate.** Use the small boxes on the grid to rate each of your ideas based on each criterion. For example: Option for a project: Making a diorama. Criterion: Materials. Ask yourself: Do I have the materials to make a diorama?

somewhat workable in terms of the criterion, give it **2 points**

not so workable, give it **1 point**

not at all workable, give it **0 points**

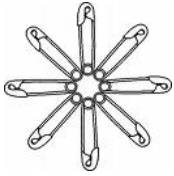

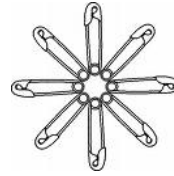
